

Legal context for species at risk in BC

- Provincial and local governments can provide protection for species at risk through existing tools
 - Water Act
 - Wildlife Act
 - Green bylaws
- SARA provides protection to federally listed species on all land types across
 Canada





SARA on private land


- Landowners and managers can choose how to conserve species and their habitat
- Environment Canada can support these actions
- At the end of the day, species and their habitat must be "effectively protected"





How we identify Critical Habitat

- "To the extent possible, based on the best available information"
- Linked to population& distributionobjectives



CH ID is comprised of:

- A geographic location or area within which CH is found
- Biophysical attributes

Recovery Strategy for the Pacific Water Shrew (Sorex bendirii) in British Columbia



place








Critical Habitat Protection— What we hope local governments can provide

 Stewardship agreements


